



President's Report

December 16, 2021



Historic December winds left extensive infrastructure and tree damage across OPPD's service area, and teams got right to work.



- ~24,000 outages at peak, spread across the service area
- **6 transmission** lines and 41 structures damaged
- More than 150 distributions poles down
- Over 100 crews on site to restore
- More than 70% of outages restored within 24 hours, from peak
- **Zero safety incidents**

November Baseload Generation

- Nebraska City Unit 1 – Capacity Factor: 65.7%
- Nebraska City Unit 2 – Capacity Factor: 31.7%
- North Omaha Unit 4 – Capacity Factor: 68.5%
- North Omaha Unit 5 – Capacity Factor: 52%

November Peaking Generation

- Cass County – Capacity Factor 3.5%
- Jones Street – Capacity Factor 0.1%
- North Omaha Unit 1 – Capacity Factor 0%
- North Omaha Unit 2 – Capacity Factor 0%
- North Omaha Unit 3 – Capacity Factor 0%
- Sarpy County – Capacity Factor 5%

November Renewables

- Renewable energy contributed 42.4% of OPPD's retail energy sales.
- Wind capacity factor of 50.4%
- Capacity Factor for Community Solar 13%.
