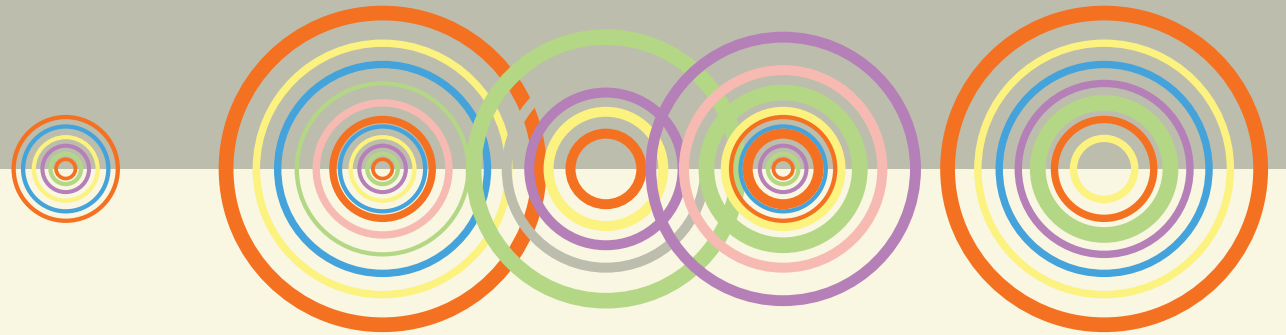

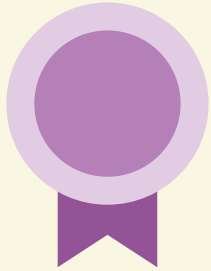


Outage Communications
